A report was received from our District Councillor Mr D Simpson about the local plan changes due to the change in Government. Other topics discussed at the meeting included the Pig Hanging Tree, potholes and the recent Highways officers visit. The clerk is also to provide detailed costs for Community Speed Watch equipment and also Pole Mounted Speed Devices for the next meeting. Ideas for Community Projects were requested. Use of the Community Woodland was also discussed and whether we could monitor the wildlife species which use the area.

Community Woodland

Hayes Furlong Wood; Belchford and Fulletby's Community Woodland has continued to develop through the spring and summer of 2024. Many thanks to John Smith for mowing paths and rides through the new trees, making the woodland a lovely place for a quiet walk for solitary enjoyment or group events with

fabulous views across the Wolds. There's also a place to shelter from the wind and take a rest. The Woodland is open all the time for everyone to enjoy. Most of the Community Woodland area was previously an arable field and this space is being allowed to regenerate naturally. We are seeing more birds, small mammals and wildflowers each year. Parish Councillors Peter Thompson and Paul Barnes are considering working with local conservation groups and looking to use new technology to track bird, mammal and other species numbers visiting this new diverse woodland and conservation area. This will help us measure the success of everyone's effort to make this a centre piece of excellence for a newly created woodland, wetland and community space for all to enjoy.

The technical data recording equipment was located on a telegraph pole outside number 7 Church View which commenced on the 14th August 2024. It continued for a full seven-day period. We have had the results back from the Data Collection Analyst. We will be adding this to the agenda for the next PC meeting and we will then share the data. please come along. 2024 Village Picnic & Apple Tree Auction

The 2024 Fulletby village gathering was held on the Glebe Field on Sunday 18th August and we held our first Apple Auction – somewhat a misnomer as the main fruiting trees this year are pears and plums. The idea is that individuals who sponsor a tree can harvest their tree's crop for that year. In this first year we auctioned off five lots and raised £85. We hope that this will be an annual event and make a significant contribution to funding our outgoings.

Two Picnic Tables:

At the end of 2023, our East Lindsey District Councillor, Daniel Simpson, supported Fulletby Glebe Field's application for a grant of £400 to pay for two picnic tables, placed in the field in July. Belchford and Fulletby Parish Council donated the proceeds of the 2024 Lane Letting to the Fulletby Glebe Field. A record £339 was raised enabling us to get not only a bench but a plaque as well, which reads,
